Teachers have worked alongside to observe teaching and support with teaching.</p> <p>Children have received high quality PE lessons and teachers have received quality CPD. Learning for both pupils and staff has been deepened and has had a positive impact. The PE leader has received 3 days training and all teaching staff have received a full days CPD. This included a session on the theory and how to use the scheme and an observation session. The REAL PE trainer came into school and taught in each year group as teachers observed. This session was evaluated as excellent. The PE leader has observed lessons throughout school and has attended all sports tournaments with the pupils involved. The scheme will be used from September 2018.</p>
